

New Report Finds EVs Provide Savings For All Floridians

MJ Bradley & Associates released a report that evaluated the costs and benefits of increased penetration of plug-in electric vehicles (PEV) in Florida. The analysis projects financial benefits for all electric utility customers due to greater utilization of the electric grid during low load hours and resulting in increased utility revenues from PEV charging.
