Tennessee and South Carolina Open Comment Period for VW Settlement Plans

Volkswagen violated the Clean Air Act by installing 'defeat devices' on their vehicles. As a result they must pay \$14.7 billion dollars in settlement funding nationwide to reduce air pollution.

Tennessee has released a proposed Beneficiary Mitigation Plan for how to spend Tennessee's portion of the funding. They have chosen to allocate the maximum amount allowed by the agreement or 15% of the state's 45.7 million dollars for electric vehicle service equipment (EVSE). New Report Assesses the U.S. Electric Vehicle Market and the Actions Driving It


Expanding The Electric Vehicle Market in U.S. Cities, a report from the International Council on Clean Transportation (ICCT), catalogs actions in place, identifies best practices and identifies relationships between electric vehicle promotion actions and electric vehicle sales.
